## ORDINANCE #526

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE LIQUOR LICENSE AND CONTROL ORDINANCE

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Greenup, Cumberland County, Illinois has previously enacted the Liquor License and Control Ordinance providing for the regulation of liquor license and sale of alcohol in the Village of Greenup, Illinois;

**WHEREAS**, it has determined that restaurants having a Class E license should be allowed to be open on Sunday afternoon; and

### **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF GREENUP, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, ILLINOIS:**

**Section 1:** The findings made in the prefatory portion of this Ordinance are hereby adopted..

**Section 2:** Section 5.04.130 is amended as follows:

Except as herein provided, it is unlawful to sell or to offer for sale at retail, alcoholic liquor between the hours of twelve a.m. and seven a.m. of any day. It is unlawful to sell or to offer for sale any alcoholic liquor between the hours of twelve a.m. Sunday and seven a.m. of the next succeeding Monday, except as herein provided:

Class A licenses as authorized by this chapter shall be permitted to sell beer and wine for consumption on the premises between the hours of twelve noon on Sunday and nine p.m. Sunday, providing such sale is incidental to and related to the retail sale of prepared food for each customer and providing such sale and consumption occurs on the premises where sold.

Class E licenses as authorized by this chapter shall be permitted to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises between the hours of 12:00 p.m. Noon on Sunday and 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, providing such sale is incidental to and related to the retail sale of prepared food for each customer and providing such sale and consumption occurs on the premises where sold.

Class B and Class H licenses as authorized by this chapter shall be permitted to sell alcoholic liquor in sealed packages, but not for consumption on the premises where sold between the hours of twelve noon on Sunday and nine p.m. Sunday.

Class A, C, D, and F license holders authorized by this chapter may apply to the Village President to extend the closing hour by one hour and sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises up until one a.m. on Sunday morning or up until one a.m. on New Year's Eve/New Year's morning. Said license holders shall be granted any of these extended hours a maximum of twelve times within a calendar year. Said license holders shall make written application to the Village President at least thirty days prior to the date extended hours are requested. Applications for such extended hours shall be approved by the Village President as Liquor Control Commissioner if the Village President determines the application to extend the closing hour is consistent with all laws, regulations, ordinances and public good. Applications that are not approved are of no effect. (Ord. 425, 2005; Ord. 423(part), 2005; Ord. 375, 2000; Ord. 318, 1990; Ord. 162 §13, 1969).

**Section 3:** Section 5.04.135 is amended as follows:

A. Holders of Class C, D, and F licenses may sell alcoholic beverages between the hours of 12:01 p.m. and nine p.m. on any given Sunday after first obtaining approval of the President and Board of Trustees. Each of said license holders shall be granted any of these extended hours a maximum of five times within a calendar year.

B. The President and Board of Trustees shall indicate their approval by the passage of a motion or resolution by the majority of the members of the Board.

C. It is consistent with all laws, regulations, this ordinance and the public good.
