

ATTENTION ALL GREENUP RESIDENTS

The Village of Greenup Utility Department will begin spraying mosquitoes on Mondays and Thursdays starting May 4, 2026, and ending October 29, 2026.

The name and type of pesticide to be used is:

Perm – X UL 4-4

This pesticide controls adult mosquitoes, biting and non-biting midges, black flies, and other outdoor flying insects.

It is used as a ULV thermal or non-thermal aerosol using ground or aerial equipment in areas including residential, recreational, parks, campsites, woodland, athletic fields, golf courses, municipality playgrounds, and non-crop waste areas and over listed growing crops and range grasses prior to harvest for the control of adult mosquitoes and biting flies with or adjacent to these areas.

Pesticide Application on Rights-of-Way Notification

Act

Public Act 103-0976 regulates the use of pesticides in municipalities. This Act provides that municipalities and government entities provide 24 hours of notice to the public before applying a pesticide on a public right of way within the corporate boundaries of a municipality.

The notice must include location and date of intended applications, name and type of pesticide to be used, reason for use, concentrations, any special instructions, name and telephone number of the applicator, and the contact information for the Illinois Department of Agriculture. The notice must be in writing and posted at least 24 hours before the intended application. Written notice is sufficient if posted in newsletters, websites, calendars or other correspondence currently published by the government entity. Posting on a bulletin board is not sufficient.

This Act is effective January 1, 2025.

Unit of Local Government -

Means a unit of local government, as defined in Article VII, Section 1 of the Illinois Constitution, except a park district, forest preserve district or conservation district.

Illinois Constitution, Article VII (Local Government), Section 1 (Municipalities and Units of Local Government)

"Units of local government" means counties, municipalities, townships, special districts, and units, designated as units of local government by law, which exercise limited governmental powers or powers in respect to limited governmental subjects, but does not include school districts.

Exemptions -

from the requirements of this Act.

Who has to give notice??

The State or a unit of local government or a commercial entity hired by the State or local unit of government who applies a pesticide to a public right-of-way that is located within the corporate boundaries of a municipality.

This includes mosquito abatement districts making applications to control mosquitos.

When must notice be given?

Notice must be given at least 24 hours before the application.

What forms of Notice are acceptable?

Written notification is sufficient if posted in newsletters, websites, calendars or other correspondence currently published by the state or local entity in which the application is to be made.

Posting on a bulletin board is not sufficient.

What must be included in the Notice?

1. The intended location, date range and range of times during the day that the material may be applied;
2. The brand name, common name, and scientific name of each product that may be applied;
3. The type of pesticide contained in any product that may be applied;
4. The reason for use of each product that may be applied;
5. The range of concentrations of any end-use product that will be applied;
6. Any special instructions appearing on the label of the product applicable to an individual's use of the public right-of-way following an application;
7. The State agency, mosquito abatement district, or other unit of local government name and telephone number of the certified applicator;
8. Contact information for the Illinois Department of Agriculture's Pesticide Misuse Section, including a telephone number and website information for the Department. *(See above)*

AN ACT concerning safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the the
Pesticide Application on Rights-of-Way Notification Act.

Section 5. Definitions. In this Act:

"Department" means the Department of Agriculture.

"Pesticide" has the meaning given in the Illinois
Pesticide Act.

"Unit of local government" means a unit of local
government, as defined in Article VII, Section 1 of the
Illinois Constitution, except a park district, forest preserve
district, or conservation district.

Section 10. Prior notification requirements for
application of pesticides on rights-of-way.

(a) At least 24 hours before the State or a unit of local
government, including a mosquito abatement district or a
commercial entity hired by the State or a unit of local
government, applies a pesticide, including a pesticide
intended to control mosquitoes, to a public right-of-way that
is located within the corporate boundaries of a municipality,
the State, mosquito abatement district, or other unit of local
government in which the application is to be made shall
provide written notice to the public of the application of the
pesticide. At a minimum, the following information shall be
provided in the written notice required under this subsection
(a):

- (1) the intended location, date range, and range of
times during the day that the material may be applied;
- (2) the brand name, common name, and scientific name
of each product that may be applied;
- (3) the type of pesticide contained in any product
that may be applied;
- (4) the reason for use of each product that may be
applied;
- (5) the range of concentrations of end-use product
that will be applied;
- (6) any special instructions appearing on the label of
the product applicable to an individual's use of the
public right-of-way following an application;
- (7) the State agency, mosquito abatement district, or
other unit of local government name and telephone number
of the certified applicator; and
- (8) contact information for the Department for
complaints of pesticide misuse, including a telephone
number and website information for the Department.

Written notification required under this subsection (a) is
sufficient if posted in newsletters, websites, calendars, or
other correspondence currently published by the State,
mosquito abatement district, or other unit of local government
in which the application is to be made, but posting on a

bulletin board is not sufficient.

(b) The application of a solid mosquito larvicide in accordance with 8 Ill. Adm. Code 250.210 is exempt from the notification requirements of this Section.

(c) The State or a unit of local government, including a mosquito abatement district, need not provide the notice required by this Section if the application of the pesticide is in response to (i) disease causing agents in vector mosquitoes, (ii) the occurrence of mosquito-borne disease in animal or human populations, or (iii) a natural disaster recovery effort.

Section 15. Administrative rules. This Act shall be administered and enforced by the Department. The Department may adopt rules as necessary for the enforcement of this Act.

Section 20. Penalties.

(a) When an administrative hearing is held by the Department, the hearing officer, upon determination of any violation of this Act or rule or regulation, shall either refer the violation to the State's Attorney in the county where the alleged violation occurred for prosecution or levy the following administrative monetary penalties:

- (1) a penalty of \$250 for a first violation;
- (2) a penalty of \$500 for a second violation; and
- (3) a penalty of \$1,000 for a third or subsequent violation.

(b) The penalty levied under subsection (a) shall be collected by the Department, and all penalties collected by the Department under this Act shall be deposited into the Pesticide Control Fund. Any penalty not paid within 60 days of notice from the Department shall be submitted to the Attorney General for collection.

(c) Upon prosecution by a State's Attorney, a violation of this Act or rules adopted under this Act shall be a petty offense subject to a fine of \$250 for a first offense, a fine of \$500 for a second offense, and a fine of \$1,000 for a third or subsequent offense.

Effective Date: 1/1/2025
